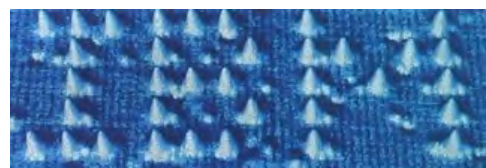
Our second Science Camp payment of \$100 was due by November 24. If you made the first two payments, your balance due is \$235. This final payment is due by Wednesday, February 10.

This week students have been reviewing taxonomy and why we might want to remember that King Philip Came Over For Grape Soda. Pages to read, questions to answer, in-class activities, and a movie will be followed by an exploration of birds to finish up our Kingdom Animalia chart. This will lead to our Raptor and Owl Pellet Project.

Students can find the Taxonomy Web Quest Power Point posted at the bottom of this page as an attachment. Download it, view it as a slide show, and do the tasks as directed on the slides. Students will be asked to click links to view Internet web sites, read information, answer questions, and create and fill in charts using their own paper as answer documents.

Eighth Grade Science

In the last weeks before the vacation, students enjoyed learning about Static Electricity. They removed some electrons from their hair, leaving positively charged atoms that repelled one another and caused their hair to stand on end. They piled extra electrons on balloons and used them to attract salt crystals, strips of paper, and a stream of water. They also took an introductory quiz on which a fabulous 47 students earned scores of "C and above." Well done!

Students continued their electron manipulation as they induced a positive charge on the White Board. They modeled what had happened at the sub-atomic level with girls taking the role of protons, and boys taking the role of electrons. They also watched a Bill Nye movie, took notes, filled in a Study Guide, and took another quiz - a 35 point challenge with questions on basic atomic structure and theory, the early philosophers and scientists, and static electricity. An excellent 42 students earned scores of "C and above" on this quiz. Well done! Congratulations to high scorers Kevin C, Trenton C, Blakeney F, Ben H, Brandon L, Renee R, Garrett T, Donovan L, Michael C. Jackson D, Cody H, Aneesa I, Jack A, and especially Alex S and Daniel S, who earned scores of "A+."

Students have now begun their Element Project. Their research assignment is posted on SnapGrades, and reference links and research questions are posted as attachments to this newsletter (below). Remember, all sources must be cited, and web pages from which information is taken are to be printed out and attached to the research data. Each student will create a cube to display element information as well as make a brief presentation to the class. Students will concurrently be learning about the Periodic Table and how it reveals the structure and behavior of the elements.

Mathematics

ALL EARNSHAW'S CLASSES:

Both Pre-Algebra and Algebra started Chapter 6 in their books. This week was tough for all to get back into the swing of things, but overall I have been pleased with our progress. I will be at a workshop next Friday, January 15th and will have a substitute. In the coming two weeks, I will be giving all my students the basic skills test again that we took in the beginning of the year to see how we've grown. It will not be graded, but will be scored and returned to students promptly.

Pre-Algebra has been working on percents. The first half of Chapter 6 is on understanding how to find percents, while the second half is focused on discounts, markups, and interest. This would be a good time to start pointing out to students how you work with percents in everyday life. This might include how to figure in a tip at a restaurant, bank and loan interest, etc. A great at home activity for those of you who give an allowance, is to increase or decrease the amount by a 5%, 10%, etc. for certain chores. Or by offering a choice like: doing the laundry to increase your allowance by 5% or would you rather dry the dishes for \$1. Which is the better deal? Just an example! Email me any ideas you might have that I could share out.

FYI that the end of the semester is coming up on us fast. The switching around of electives and enrichment does tend to affect the class schedules in the middle school. For example, if a student just needs one more class before they graduate, and it is only offered during their current math time, then that class period may change, which may affect another, for someone else. You can see the domino effect. Do don't be surprised if your class schedule changes!

Algebra

Algebra classes are working on Systems of Equations. There are lots of great situations here that include comparing business models or in cost analysis. Right now we are working on the skill, but applications will be coming, and it would be great if you could spend some time with students asking them about what they currently understand about systems. Many of them think they "get it" and then struggle to explain it. Explaining your math thinking is a great way to reinforce the information. If you're not confident

We will be finishing up Chapter 9 next week then taking some time to evaluate our progress. It is my goal that third trimester will be dedicated to learning topics in Geometry.

After a nice long break from school, I feel rejuvenated and refreshed. I am excited to teach this group of students as they are engaged and excited about math. It is a pleasure to come to Charter every day!

A note on grading for Algebra this unit: For this unit, I will be taking problems directly from the homework to put together the quizzes. On homework, be on the look out for 3s and 4s. If your student is getting a 3 or 4, that tells us that they are struggling with the concept and would benefit from some additional support. If they are getting 5s, they are generally understanding the concept even if they make a few mistakes.

Whenever you feel you need help in Spanish, please come see me. Don't let it build up until it becomes absolutely overwhelming or until the end of the next trimester, when all of a sudden the world is going to end if you don't immediately raise your grade. Remember that if you are feeling this way, it is your responsibility to come ask me.

Parents: if you would still like to volunteer time either inside or outside my classroom, please email me. You needn't be fluent or even that good at speaking Spanish to volunteer.

Online translators are banned from use. This is for at least two primary reasons:

- 1) they are not accurate
- 2) they do not help you learn Spanish

Please refrain from using them. And if you need more incentive for keeping your distance, know that I can tell when you use them.

Booksmart has the dictionaries I mentioned several weeks ago. If/when more dictionaries are needed, Booksmart will re-order. Again, this is not required, but **I highly recommend it**. The price is right at \$4. Even if you already have a dictionary, I highly recommend getting this one as well to keep in your binders (it's hole punched and has a nice reference guide in the back).

Also available at Booksmart are four laminated and hole-punched reference guides. There is one for Conversation, Grammar, Vocabulary, and Verbs. The

Lessons for Life (11/5)

The students have been working hard this last month on their Life Lessons Informative Speech. This week they watched the movie "The Great Debaters." The students saw a black debate team from the 1930s in Texas struggle with racial prejudices and overcoming huge obstacles to reach their dreams. Not only did the students get inspirations for their speeches next week, they all want to participate in a debate! That might be something I can arrange in the Spring.

The students have been assigned their speech day which will be either Monday, Nov. 9th or Tuesday, Nov. 10th. I am looking forward to hearing all these amazing speeches!

Yearbook (Funke 10/9)

Our cover is complete. Coming next week a sneak peak at the 2009-2010 yearbook. Staff is hard at work, designing pages, taking pictures and planning the layout for a fabulous book. We spend a lot of time in the beginning talking about design and looking at what makes a good design and how to take and choose good photographs. Student surveys went out last week and soon we will be importing pictures onto our portrait pages. Have your students show you what they've been working on. They can access the program from home.

Nutrition (Storlie, 12/10)

We just finished up our lesson on Food Safety and Sanitation. The students should be pointing out different situations that contribute to Food Borne Illnesses. This next week students are working on their last big project in Nutrition. It is to write a book covering various topics that we have covered in class. It is so much fun to see the variety of creative ideas they have come up with.

One word for this week-- BACON!! Wow- the kids

Life Skills (Anex, 01/08)

In this section of Life Skills, students will help to direct the course of the class based on their own needs and interests as maturing adolescents. Topics they will definitely cover include social and academic survival skills, drug and alcohol abuse, gang avoidance, and human reproduction.

In the last weeks before the vacation, students continued their unit on drug and alcohol use and abuse. They were presented with a number of drug and alcohol "Situations" and asked to ponder relevant practical and ethical considerations in discussion and written responses. They were also asked to discuss one Situation with parents. Many thanks to those parents who took the time to enjoy thoughtful conversations with their student in response to this assignment!

Students also made origami holiday ornaments - a productive and entertaining life skill taught by Justin Lyle. Thank you, Justin!

Each student had written his or her own obituary - the words someone could have said about the student were his or her life to have ended in December. This week, each student wrote a "far in the future" obituary - looking "back" on a life well lived.

Currently, students are working in the last unit of this class in which we weave together all the concepts we have considered and look at who we are, what it would mean to be in a relationship, and how we might behave in a close relationship with another person. In this unit, we also review human reproduction, a topic taught in Middle School science, puberty, and a consideration of intimate behavior.

There will be one last graded "check in" of Hero Project progress in January. As the semester is rapidly drawing to a close, it is important that students work diligently to fulfill their commitment to this project. Students should have statements in evidence of their participation signed by a supervising adult and entered in their project log book with a description of their accomplishment.

Each student will make a poster celebrating the accomplishments of another student in the Hero Project. Thus a poster celebrating each student's efforts

did some great dishes including the secret ingredient; bacon. Bacon Burgers, Baked Potato Soup, Pasta dishes and even bacon wrapped appetizers. The staff in the office always love the days that Iron Chef is presenting their recipes. We bring them samples to get feedback on the dishes. The Charter School campus smelled wonderful this week.

Academic Management (Mosher, 12/9)

The students just completed a "Time of Your Life" look at how many hours in each day are spent in various activities. It was interesting to see that with most students spending 30% of their time sleeping and 30% at school, they are left with 40% "free time". The average student in my class spends of that "free time" 10% on homework which leaves another 30% for choice time. I think some students were surprised at how much time they spend at video games, TV, and cell phone texting. Other students were surprised by how much time is spent traveling in the car each day. We talked about that if they aren't getting the grades they want, some of that extra 30% of time should be added to their homework time. It was also pointed out that all the time in the car could be time spent studying note cards, looking over quiz/test information, and reading.

7. Write a letter requesting a Letter of Recommendation. Write one on your computer. Include information about your accomplishments and goals. Fill in addressee information, and send - WITH A STAMPED ENVELOPE ADDRESSED TO THE SCHOOL TO WHICH YOU ARE APPLYING - to each person from whom you are requesting a letter.

8. Submit your requests for transcripts to Nancy.

9. Submit your request for a teacher evaluation to each teacher from whom you would like to receive one. Teachers should be asked to give the form to the office for inclusion in the packet that will be sent to the school to which you are applying.

NOTE: The sooner you do these things, the more attention your requests are given. Better letters and recommendations are usually written for those whose applications are first received, before the writer is burdened by many requests.

Here is what you already should have done:

1. Check out the **website** of the school that interests you. Take a look at the online school newsletter, Student Handbook, virtual campus tour, and other features to help you know what the school is like.

2. Read over the Registration information on the website and download or request the **Registration Packet**.

3. If you are interested in more than one Catholic HS, determine if your favorite school prefers to have you take the **admission test** there. If your favorite school cares, sign up to take the test there. (Your test scores will be sent to all the Catholic schools to which you apply.)

4. Submit the initial page(s) of the Registration Packet and the fee required for registration, reserving a test
